Linda Pond received a Bachelor of Science in Middle School Education from the College of William and Mary, a Master's in Education from Old Dominion University, and a Gifted Endorsement from the University of Virginia. She became a national trainer with the AIMS Center for Math and Science Education, which required intensive science and mathematics integration coursework and professional development training at Fresno Pacific University. She facilitated professional staff development integrated mathematics and science workshops with dedicated educators across the country for 20 years.

Pond was an elementary and middle school educator with the Williamsburg/James City County school division from 1988-2000 and worked with Virginia Beach Public Schools as a Gifted Educator from 2000-06. She joined the Teaching and Learning Department in the Darden College of Education and Professional Studies in 2006 as a PK-6 Mathematics and Science Methods Lecturer. Pond was promoted to both a Senior and Master Lecturer during her tenure at ODU and engaged in multi-disciplinary research initiatives within the community.
