MOTION FOR CLOSED SESSION

The Rector recognized Ms. Kirk, who made the following motion: "Mr. Chairman, I move that this meeting be convened in closed session, as permitted by Virginia Code Section 2.2-3711(A)(6) and (2), for the purpose of discussion or consideration of funds where competition or bargaining is involved, where, if public initially, the financial interest of the governmental unit would be adversely affected, and the award of a public contract involving the expenditure of public funds, including interviews or bidders or offerors, and discussion of the terms or scope of such contract, where discussion in an open session would adversely affect the bargaining position or negotiating strategy of the public body, specifically, the expansion of post-graduate professional school opportunities offered by the institution." <u>RECONVENE IN OPEN SESSION AND FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT</u> <u>CERTIFICATION</u>
