Policy #3003 DETECTION, INVESTIGATION AND REPORTING O F FRAUD, WASTE AND ABUSE

A. PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is testablish University policy and responsibilities concerning the detection, investigation and reporting of fraudrasteandabuse

B. AUTHORITY

<u>Code of Vrginia Section 23-1301, as amende</u>dgrants authority to the Board of Visitors to make rules and policies concerniting institution. Section 6.01(a)(6) of the <u>Board of Visitors</u> <u>Bylaws</u>grants authority to the President to implement the policies and procedures of the Board relating to University operations. Section 7.01 of the Board of Visitors Bylaws grants specific authority to the Chief Audit Executive

Code of Virginia, Section -3038

D. SCOPE

This policy applies to all employeessudents, volunteers, employees of affiliated organizations who are paid through the University, and visitors to the institution. Employees include all staff, administrators, faculty, fullor part-time, and classified or nonclassified persons who are paid by the University. Students include all persons admitted to the University have not completed a program of stud for which they were enrolled,tusdent status continues whether or not the University's programs are in session. Affiliated organizations are separate entities that exist for the benefit of the University through an operating agreement include the foundations, the Community Development Corporation, and the Alumni Associations include guests and all other persons located on property, owned, texts or otherwise controlled by the University.

E. POLICY STATEMENT

The <u>Code of Virginia</u>, <u>Section</u><u>O</u><u>A</u><u>A</u><u>B</u>, <u>as amende</u><u>d</u>requires that "Upon the discovery of circumstances suggesting a reasonable possibility that a fraudulent transaction has occurred involving funds or <u>porperty</u> under the control of any . . . agency of the Commonwealth as to which one or more officers or employees state or local government may be party thereto, the state agency head. . shall promptly report such information to the Auditor **of**<u>B</u><u>R</u> Accounts (Auditor), the State Inspector Generand the Superintendent of State Police (Superintendent).

F. PROCEURES

Upon discovery of information or circumstances suggesting fraveaste orabuse it is the responsibility of University employees and students to immediately notify either <u>State</u> <u>Employee Fraud</u>, <u>Waste</u>, and <u>Abuse Hotoin</u>the University Audit Department. The individual may also additionally contact other University departments such as the Department of Human Resources, the Department of Public Safety, Office of Finanderaddiversity CounselWhen fraud, or circumstances suggeing fraud, is reported to any of these offices, the other fraud above should be contacted in a timely manner to inform them of the situation warranted

The above departments should agree as to the respective roles each office should have in the investigation of the situation. Different circumstances may require different departments to lead the investigation (.g., if the situation is criminal, financial or administrative in nature).

Upon notifications of possible fraud, the UniversitAuditor should ensure that the proper authorities within the department and University management have been notified of the potential loss The University Auditor should work to ensure that the University promptly notifies other state departments as required under Section **138** of the Code of Virginia.
